Dear Colleague:

The Center for Alcohol and Addiction Studies (CAAS) at Brown University is seeking to recruit early-career behavioral, biomedical, and social scientists for our postdoctoral training program funded by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism and the National Institute on Drug Abuse (T32AA007459, T32DA016184). As our understanding of substance use disorders becomes more complex, so too does the training needs of early-career scientists. To meet the challenge of advancing treatments for the millions of people who struggle to reduce their alcohol and other drug use, the field requires highly trained researchers who can integrate a variety of cutting-edge concepts and methods.

Distinctive features of our fellowship include its interdisciplinary nature, focus on training in early intervention and treatment along a continuum with attention to crucial health disparities, and emphasis on highly individualized opportunities to develop competitive grant applications and by doing so, contribute new knowledge to the base of alcohol- and other drug-related dysfunction and treatment. We emphasize that intervention should be guided by sophisticated and fully developed theory that considers biological, social, psychological, and cultural influences and contexts. We stress the importance of integrating theory, research, and the latest technologies to advance prevention and intervention strategies across development. Fellows gain expertise in the most rigorous and precise experimental and clinical trial methods, and learn the most cutting edge and powerful statistical techniques.

Fellows must have received a doctorate degree (e.g., PhD, MD, PsyD, DDS, ScD, etc.) or equivalent from an accredited domestic or foreign organization. Stipends are set by the National Institutes of Health and depend on the fellow's number of years of postdoctoral training.

Applications are due December 10, 2021 (early decision) and January 04, 2022 (regular decision). Reviews will continue until the positions are filled. Starting dates will vary from July 1 to September 1, 2022. Brown University is an affirmative action/equal opportunity employer and actively solicits applications from women and minorities. CAAS is committed to the recruitment and retention of fellows from historically underrepresented racial and ethnic groups.
