Counseling and Counseling Psychology Program

Assistant Professor (Clinical)

Non-Tenure Track Faculty

Job Description:

The Counseling Program invites applications for a Clinical Assistant Professor position. This will be a full-time, non-tenure track, renewable, 12-month appointment (beginning 8/1/2020) in the Counseling and Counseling Psychology Programs within the Department of Counseling and Educational Psychology in the School of Education at Indiana University.

Seeking a candidate who can contribute to our growing undergraduate Counseling minor and our proposed undergraduate Counseling and Student Services major. The proposed undergraduate major is in the final stages of the approval process. Our ideal candidate will be a faculty member qualified for a clinical assistant professor position who has a commitment to undergraduate teaching and who can provide pedagogical supervision and training to doctoral level associate instructors who teach undergraduate courses. In addition, this clinical faculty position will contribute to the teaching, training, and supervision of master's level and doctoral level students in our MPCAC accredited and APA accredited programs within the Department of Counseling and Educational Psychology. It would be beneficial to the program if the qualified candidate has interests in social justice, career counseling, assessment, or addictions.

The ideal candidate will have a commitment to social justice and diversity consistent with our program's statement of multicultural aspirations available [here](https://education.indiana.edu/students/graduates/program-specific/counseling-psychology/index.html) (<https://education.indiana.edu/students/graduates/program-specific/counseling-psychology/index.html>). Indiana University values candidates who have experience working in settings with students from diverse backgrounds, and who possess a strong commitment to improving access to higher education for historically underrepresented students.

Principal Duties/Responsibilities:

- Teach a fall/spring/summer course load. Number of courses per semester 3 fall/3 spring/2 summer (total of 8 classes per year (e.g., mostly undergraduate courses in the counseling minor and proposed major as well as the graduate level pedagogy course for doctoral students with Associate Instructor positions)
Note: We may request a course load reduction if there are administrative duties assigned to this position.
- Organize and deliver the Associate Instructor orientation and training prior to the beginning of fall classes
- Observe and provide feedback to Associate Instructors to enhance their teaching
- Coordinate the service learning portion of the undergraduate curriculum
- Contribute to program related service activities such as clinical supervision of counseling trainees, committee work, and graduate advising.

Minimum Required Qualifications:

- Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology or closely related field by anticipated start date
- A minimum of 2 years of university teaching experience and interest in teaching at the undergraduate level
- Ability to provide pedagogy supervision and training

- Licensed or license-eligible as a psychologist (HSPP), licensed mental health counselor (LMHC), or licensed clinical addictions counselor (LCAC) in Indiana

Preferred Qualifications:

- Two years of experience as a psychologist post-licensure
- Interest in clinical supervision of counseling trainees
- 5 years of teaching experience at the undergraduate level
- Experience teaching online courses
- A record of scholarship of teaching or research experience (quantitative or qualitative)
- Ability to provide research advising to doctoral students

Program Information:

The Counseling and Counseling Psychology Programs are housed within the Department of Counseling and Educational Psychology. The Counseling programs at IU include a 48-credit hour master's program in school counseling, a 60-credit hour master's program in clinical mental health counseling, and an APA-accredited PhD program in counseling psychology. We are committed to training ethically and multiculturally oriented counseling professionals who identify with the social justice mission espoused by the program.
