Two Scholarship Opportunities for Psychopharmacology Students

Eligible applicants are invited to apply for both scholarships.



2022 Beth N. Rom-Rymer Scholarships *Applications due February 1, 2022*

Description: Up to nine \$5,000 scholarships. The Beth N. Rom-Rymer scholarships provide support to both graduate students and practicing, licensed psychologists to complete their training in psychopharmacology programs, which adhere to the APA model curriculum of didactic training in clinical psychopharmacology. The purpose of the Rom-Rymer scholarships is to encourage talented psychologists, with recognized leadership skills, and with demonstrated passion for growing the field, to become prescribing psychologists, engaged in providing the highest caliber, comprehensive, integrated care to the most at-risk members of the community.

Eligibility: Applicants must be graduate students or practicing, licensed psychologists with evidence of having enrolled in a training program in clinical psychopharmacology. The Rom-Rymer scholarships are open to applicants of all career stages: mid- and senior-level psychologists, as well as graduate students, and early career psychologists, including those who entered psychology later in life. Preference will be given to applicants who are committed to working with the underserved.

Application materials include:

- Self-statement on how the applicant fulfills the purpose of the scholarship
- Academic transcript for applicants who are predoctoral
- Two (2) letters of recommendation supporting the applicant's qualifications with reference to the purpose of the scholarship

2022 Walter Katkovsky Scholarships *Applications due March 1, 2022*

Description: Up to seven \$5,000 scholarships. The Walter Katkovsky scholarships support early career postdoctoral licensed psychologists (no more than 10 years postdoctoral) in clinical or counseling to obtain training in psychopharmacology. The Katkovsky scholarships are intended to encourage opportunities for psychologists to join healthcare teams and benefit patients who have psychological and medical problems.

Eligibility: Applicants must be either accepted into an APA designated program or currently enrolled in their first year (first or second semester) at the time the application is due. Applicants must be early career licensed psychologists (up to 10 years postdoctoral) in clinical or counseling psychology. Preference will be given to applicants with current or pending opportunities to work collaboratively with medical professionals in a medical setting (e.g., hospitals, clinics, or community health centers).

Application materials include:

- Self-statement on how the applicant fulfills the eligibility requirements and how the applicant will be able to provide enhanced patient care through psychopharmacology training
- Two (2) letters of recommendation supporting the applicant's qualifications with reference to the purpose of the scholarship
